Minneapolis native, 23-year-old Kenneth Broberg won the silver medal at the Fifteenth Van Cliburn International Piano Competition for performances that showed "an imaginative shaping of themes, revelation of inner voices, and an unfailing sense of momentum" (Texas Classical Review). This exciting newcomer

to the classical piano stage will appear Sunday, January 21, 2018 at 2:30 p.m. at Trianon Theatre in San Jose.

Broberg's first CD has just been released on the Decca Gold label, and features some of his Cliburn Competition performances.

The first musician in his family, Mr. Broberg began piano lessons at age six, when he was fascinated by his mother's upright—a wedding gift from her parents. He studied for nine years with Dr. Joseph Zins before entering the University of Houston's Moores School of Music, where, studying with Nancy Weems, he earned a Bachelor of Music degree in 2016. He resides in Parkville, Missouri, under the guidance at Park University of 2001 Cliburn Gold Medalist Stanislav Ioudenitch.

Broberg agreed to come to Silicon Valley when the pianist scheduled for this concert date, Michel Dalberto, had a change in touring plans that eliminated his U.S. performance for Steinway Society.

"While we are sorry to miss Dalberto's planned program and his incredible artistry," said Nancy Jensen, Artistic Director for Steinway Society, "we are thrilled to have Kenny join us. I heard him play at the Competition, and he is a gifted and exciting pianist just making his leap onto the international stage."
